8. Fiscalimplications:

The primary manner in which the Department of Mines, Minerals and Energy (DMME) addresses is sue so feliminating accidents, in juries, and fatalities in Virginia coal and mineral mines and coal bed methanew ells, and eliminating adverse environmental conditions and public safety hazards resulting from mineral and fossil fuelex traction is through regular inspections. DMME is regularly in specting all active and in active surface and underground coal mines, mineral mines, gas and oil exploration, and production operations. These in spection and enforcement activities are supported by general fund dollars, federal funds, and special funds generated from permit and license fees paid by operators.

The billincre as estheamount of the permit and license fees assessed and collected by DMME based on inflation. Many of the permit and license fees collected by DMME have remained unchanged since the 1970s, others were last increased in the early 1990s. The additional revenue would be used to support agency operations, supplanting general fund dollars removed from the agency's operating budget in the Introduced Budget Bill. Sufficient appropriation for the additional revenue is included in HB1400.
