It is too early to determine the number of personst hat would be affected by this bill. Currently, it applies to five individuals in the system and means that instead of a length of stay from 2 to 5 years, the length of stay could be renewable on an indeterminate bas is by the courts if continued hospitalization is deemed medically appropriate. In addition, individuals would be transferred from a civil unit to a forensic unit, resulting in higher treatment costs. However, current operating bed limits for both civil and forensic units are sufficient to handle the individuals covered by this bill. One negative impact is that since length of stay would increase, the turn over in beds will be less, and length of time on waiting list for individuals needing services could increase.
