5. Summary/Purpose: This legislation amends the Code of Virginia by directing the DepartmentofSocialServicestoestablishapilotsubsidizedguardianshipprogramforthe benefitofchildreninthecustodyofalocalboardofsocialservicesorotherchildwelfare agencywhoarelivingwithrelativecaregiversandwhohavebeeninfosterca reorlivingwith relatives other than natural parents for at least 18 months. A relative care giver means a support of the contraction of thepersonwhoiscaringforachildrelatedtosuchpersonforwhomtheoptionofreunification hasbeeneliminatedandterminationofparentalrights isnotappropriate. The subsidized guardianshipprogramshallprovideforaspecial -needsubsidy, which shall include a one timelump -sumpaymentforexpensesresultingfromtheassumptionofcareofthechild,a medicalsubsidycomparabletothatinado ption, and amonthly subsidy on behalf of the child payabletotherelativecaregiver. The monthly subsidy shall be equal to the prevailing foster carerate. The Department may establish an assettest for eligibility under the program. Prior totheguar dianshiphearingandpaymentofaguardianshipsubsidyforthebenefitofaminor child, a homestudy report on the relative caregivers hall be filed with the court having jurisdictionoverthechild'scasewithin15daysoftherequestforasubsidy. The caregiverreceivingaguardianshipsubsidyshallsubmitannuallytothedepartmentasworn statementthatthechildisstilllivingwithandreceivingsupportfromtheguardian. Oncethe subsidyisgranted, it continues until the child is 18 or 21ifafull -timestudent.

- **8. Fiscalimplications:** Thisbillestablishesapilotsubsidizedguardianshipprogram. The bill createstwo primary service groups. The first group is the children in foster careforwhich the goalist op lace them with relatives. The second group is those children on Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) as child only cases.

FosterCareRelativePlacementCosts :

Therewere 325 children (four percent of the total infoster care) with the goal of placement with a receive TANF (for children in their care. However, the move from foster care to TANF programs tatus would drop the average monthly payment from \$393 to \$118 perchild. The cost to maintain these cases at the foster care payment level is simply the cost of the existing foster care payments (\$1,532,700). Currently, 50.53 percent of this cost is born by the federal IV-E foster care program. Since it is very unlikely that the federal government would gran to the TANF or general fund dollars. The netannual cost for this population is simply the foregone IV-E reimbursement of \$774,473. Virginia's TANF grant is fully appropriated and therefore, this cost would have to be covered with general fund monies.

TANF"ChildOnly"CaseCosts:

In2002, therewere 9,061 TANF "childonly" cases. Although most of the TANF "child only" cases would not have gone through the foster care system, the language of the bill may be ambiguous enough to expand the cover edguardianship to all "childonly" cases. The amount of the TANF payment amount varies by the three assistance level groupings of local departments as well as the number of relative children in the family and the child sincome, if any. Using a TANF pay ment of \$118 per case per month and an average foster family rate, the monthly cost difference per case is \$275. To provide the same level of financial support to guardians of the sechildren would thus cost approximately \$29,901,300 more than current TANF payments as calculated below. Again, because Virginia's TANF grant is fully appropriated, this cost would have to be covered with general fundres our ces.

OtherCosts:

The billals ocovers other childwelf are agencies. We have no statistics on how many children might potentially be appropriate for this program from the seagencies.

Inadditiontothemonthlysubsidy,aportionofwhichcouldbefundedbyTANF,thereisa one-timeinitialpaymentaswellasmedicalsubsidy.Medicaid,FAMIS,andState -Local Hospitalizationwouldlikelycover aportionofthesechildren,butnotall.Theconditions andrestrictionsoftheone -timesubsidyandmedicalsubsidyarenotaddressedinthebill. Basedontheaverageone -timelumpsumof\$477paidinthediversionaryassistanceprogram fortransporta tion,housing,andotherneeds,andprojectingthat10percentofthecases annuallywillrequestaone -timegrant,atotalof\$432,162isestimated.Anadditional \$200,000isrequestedformedicalcostsnotcoveredbyothermedicalsubsidyprograms.

PilotProgramAssumptions

The department assumes that this program would be piloted in five localities in order to estimate the cost of this legislation. A state wide cost of the subsidies must be calculated first

andthenthepercentageoflocalitiespartici patinginthepilotappliedtothetotalstatewide costofthesubsidies. Thetotalstatewidecostforthesubsidiesinthisguardianshipprogram is\$31,307,935(\$774,473fostercarerelativesubsidies+\$29,901,300TANFchild -only subsidies+\$432,162lu mpsumpayments+\$200,000uncoveredmedicalcosts). The percentageofthetotaldepartmentsparticipatinginthepilotis4.1percent(fiveoutof121 totaldepartments) thereby yielding a costof\$1,283,625 for the subsidies in a pilot program that oper a tedinfive localities.

AdministrativeCosts

Thedepartmentestimatesthatitwillneedonefull -timeemployeeinthecentralofficeto managethepilotsubsidizedguardianshipprogram. Thecentral office employee will be a ProgramAdministrationManage rII(payband5). Themanagerwill develop and provide outreachduringyear1andadministerthesubsidiesduringyeartwoandthereafter.Usinga mid-rangesalaryof\$53,278forpayband5,salaryandbenefitswilltotal\$69,388annually. Fundstocov ertheroutineoperatingcostsofpostage, office, travel, supplies, telephone, rent, liabilityinsurance, etc. are estimated at \$7,900 per employee. One -timecoststotaling\$6,500 peremployeeareincludedinthefirstyearforofficefurnitureandequip ment.Significant automatedsystemchangeswouldbenecessarytoboththeADAPTandOASISsystems. These costs are estimated at \$500,000 for year one and \$100,000 per year thereafter. Personnel, equipment, printing, and support costs total \$87,788 in FY 04and\$78,288inFY 05.
