Adds a definition of "deductible" tomean anamount an enrollee is required to pay out of-pocket before the health care plan begins to pay the costs associated with health care services. Adds deductibles to the exception of copayments as being baid for by HMO plans. Gives HMOs the power to require a deductible or copayment, or both, from enrollees. The total deductible or deductibles for basic health care services per calendar or contract year must not exceed the maximum annual deductibles permissible pursuant to 26 U.S.C. 220 or any successor. If the federal program for the plans is terminated, the plans with deductibles that do not exceed the deductibles from the last year of the federal program plus \$50 per calendary ear afterward. The State Corporation Commission may consider fa plan's deductibles are reasonable and may use at least the following: (i) whether the deductibles will adversely affect accessibility for enrollees, (ii) whether that plan has demonstrated the ability to monitor and implement the deductible plans, and (iii) whether the plan's level of capitalization and finan cial condition are adequate.
