4. Title Dialysis Patient Care Technicians

5. Summary/Purpose: Establishes the requirement for certification from an organization approved by the Board of Health Professions for a person to use the titles "dialysis patient care technician" or "dialysis care technician." Unregulated persons performing services relating to the technical elements of dialysis, such as equipment maintenance and preparation of dialysers for reuse by the same patient, will not be affected. The Board of Health Professions is charged with approving programs examining candidates for appropriate competency or technical proficiency to perform as dialysis patient care technicians or dialysis care technicians for state certification. Individuals who are currently employed as dialysis care technicians and are administering medication shall have demonstrated competency as evidenced by holding a current valid certification from an organization approved by the Board of Health Professions.
