5.	• Summary/Purpose: This bill expands the definition of "injury" for workers' compensation purposes to include any injury, disease or condition resulting from the administration of the small pox vaccine to any employee as part of federal countermeasures.

8. Fiscalimplications: Undercurrentlaw,themajorityoflikelyinjuriesthatmayresultfrom smallpoxvaccinationswillbecoveredbyworkerscompensation. However, this bill does have the potential to increase costs becau seitadds any "condition" related to the vaccination to the definition of an injury or disease that will be covered by workers compensation. Currently, not all such conditions may be covered.

Asintroduced, the bill refersonly to hospital employees and would therefore, impacta limited number of state agencies. The agencies with the potential for themost impact are the Medical Center at the University of Virginia and the Medical College Of Virginia Authority. In addition, the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services, the Department of Health, and other agencies dealing with public health may experience some impact.

Theworkerscompensationprogramforstateemployeesisexperiencebased, and thus, any increase in premium she cause of higher than expected loss experience will be borne by the individual agencies. The addition of the Houseamend ment to this bill which expands the coverage from hospital employees to all employees does result in a larger risk of fiscal impact to agencies. However, such an impact is indeterminated ue to the unknown number of potential problems that may result from such avaccine.

Aswaspreviouslymentioned,mostvaccine -relatedinjuriesordiseaseswillbecoveredunder currentlaw.Consequently,whilesomeadditionalimpactmaybecreatedbythebill,itis likelythattheirexperience(andconsequently,theirpremiums)wouldincreaseshouldthey decidetovoluntarilyvaccinatetheiremployeeswithorwithouttheprovisionso fthisbill.
