4. Title Fees for driving under the influence conviction.

5. Summary/Purpose: The introduced legislation proposes to amend §§ 17.1 -275.5, 18.2-268.8, and 46.2 -341.26:8 of the Code of Virginia to add a fee of \$100 for driving under the influence convictions.

7. Budget amendment necessary: No.

8. Fiscal implications: The fiscal impact of this legislation is uncertain. The Commonwealth averages approximately 28,000 DUI convictions each year. If the \$100 is added it should generate approximately \$2.8 million each year assuming that all convicted persons actually pay the fee. Given the difficulty in collecting the fees, it is difficult to estimate the exact amount of revenues that will be collected. Assuming a 90 percent collection rate would equal approximately \$2.5 million in annual revenues.

9. Specific agency or political subdivisions affected: Courts

10. Technical amendment necessary: No.

11. Other comments: This bill is similar to SB1258 (SB1258 was amended in the House to add a \$50 fee) and a \$100 fee was included in language in HB1400. The budget also assumed \$2.5 million in revenues.
