## Expenditures

Aslisted above, the Bed dingprogram's current appropriation is \$228,627 and includes its directs taffing (2 classified and 3 wage employees) and support costs as well as costs associated with the management and administrative support provided the program by the Virginia Department of Health's Office of Epidemiology.

### Revenue

Repealing the Bedding & Upholstered Furniture law would terminate the Virginia Department of Health's Bedding Program and eliminate up to \$320,000 inference ue annually. Actual FY2002 revenue was \$296,1 00 and the program's revenue has increased by between 5 and 15 percent over the last four fiscal years.

TheBeddingprogram's revenue is collected in a separate fund but the *Code of Virginia* does not establish it as a dedicated or non-reverting fund. The additional revenue generated by the program and recorded in this discretionary fund detail has been reverted to the state's general fundons everal occasions. Typically this represents a reversion of fiscal year -end balances (\$120,000 in FY 2002; Part 3 -1.01 U.1 of the Budget Bill proposes the reversion of \$140,000 in Bedding fund balances in FY 2003).

### Cash-FlowAnalysisifBeddingProgramisEliminated:

Thecash -flowanalysisbelowincludesthecontinuedoperationoftheprogramthrough FY2003.InFY 2004,theprogramwouldincuruptoapproximately\$79,000inseverance andunemploymentbenefitcosts(2classifiedemployees;unemploymentonlyfor3wage employees)andapproximately\$15,000forprocessingrevenuerefundsandcorrespondence tolicensed companies.Atotalof\$140,000inFY2004revenuerefundsisalsofactoredin sincethelicenses/permitscovera12 -monthperiod.Thisfactoralsoservesasacontingency forthepotentialnegativeimpactthattherepealoftheprogrammayhaveonthere mainderof FY2003'sprogramlicense/permitrevenuecollections.
