4. Title DepartmentofHealth;regulationofbeddingandupholsteredfurniture.

5. Summary/Purpose:

Thebillstipulatesthatuponreceivingacomplaint,theCommissionerofHealthmayorder thereturnofanyitemofbeddingoruphol steredfurnitureoranyfillingmaterial.Further, uponreceivingacomplaintrelatingtoaviolationofthelawspertainingtobeddingand upholsteredfurniture,theCommissionermayrequiretheinspectionofalicenseorpermit holder'spremises.Anyv iolationoftheprovisionsofthisarticleorregulationsoftheBoard determinedundersuchinspectionswillfallundertheprovisionsoftheVirginiaConsumer ProtectionAct.Thesubstitutebilldoesnotlimittheidentificationandinspectionof unlicensedbeddingandupholsteredfurniturebusinesses.

8. Fiscalimplications:

TheFY2004 appropriation for the Virginia Department of Health's Beddingprogram's staff time and associated site travel costs is \$228,627 and is funded entirely by the annual fees charged to licensees and permitholders per Sections 32.1 -216 through 32.1 -218 of the *Code of Virginia*. This appropriation includes the current inspection of licensed and permitted vendors of bedding and uphols tered furniture and filling materials, and the identification of unlicensed vendors and any associated healthrisks in those bedding and uphols.

Basedonthebill'sprovisions, currentlicensees and permitholders would continue to pay the annual fee and nonegative revenue impact is anticipated.

Sincelicenseandpermitholders' premises would only be inspected up on the receipt of a complaint under the substitute bill's provisions, aportion of staff time would be expected to shift from the inspection of licensed/permitted premises to the identification of additional unlicensed bedding and up holstered furniture businesses. The ext ent of this shift will be driven by the volume of complaints received on licensed vendors over time under a complaint-only inspection approach and cannot be determined at this time.

Anyviolation of the provisions of this article or regulations of the Bo ard determined under such inspections will fall under the provisions of the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Affairs (VDACS) enforce the provisions of the Consumer Protection Act. The costs of processing and investigating consumer complaints cannot be captured at this time. However, the additional work may create expenses infuture biennia.
