5. Summary/Purpose:

The substitute bill stipulates that upon receiving a complaint, the Commissioner of Health may order the return of any item of bedding ngorupholstered furniture or any filling material. Further, upon receiving a complaint relating to a violation of the laws pertaining to bedding and upholstered furniture, the Commissioner may require the inspection of a license or permit holder's premines. Any violation of the provisions of this article or regulations of the Board determined under such inspections will fall under the provisions of the Virginia Consumer Protection Act. The substitute bill does not limit the identification and inspection of unlicensed bedding and upholstered furniture businesses.

8. Fiscalimplications:

TheFY2004appropriationfortheVirginiaDepartmentofHealth'sBeddingprogram's staff timeandassociatedsitetravelcostsis\$228,627andisfundedentirelybytheannualfees chargedtolicenseesandpermitholdersperSections32.1 -216through32.1 -218ofthe *Code of Virginia*. This appropriation includes the current inspection of licensed and permitted vendors of bedding and upholstered furniture and filling materials, and the identification of unlicensed vendors and any associated healthrisks in those bedding operations.

Basedonthesubstitutedbill'sprovisions, currentlicensees and permitholders would continue to pay the annual fee and nonegative revenue impactisanticipated.

Sincelicenseandpermitholders' premises would only bein spec tedup on the receipt of a complaint under the substitute bill's provisions, aportion of stafftime would be expected to shift from the inspection of licensed/permitted premises to the identification of additional unlicensed bedding and upholstered furnitu rebusinesses. The extent of this shift will be driven by the volume of complaints received onlicensed vendors over time under a complaint-only inspection approach and cannot be determined at this time.

Anyviolationoftheprovisionsofthisarticleo rregulationsoftheBoarddeterminedunder suchinspectionswillfallundertheprovisionsoftheVirginiaConsumerProtectionAct.The VirginiaDepartmentofAgricultureandConsumerAffairs(VDACS)enforcetheprovisions oftheConsumerProtectionAct. Thecostsofprocessingandinvestigatingconsumer complaintscannotbecapturedatthistime.However,theadditionalworkmaycreate expensesinfuturebiennia.
