5. Summary/Purpose:

This bill pertains to the requirements, regulations, study and report on land application of sewage sludge. The billamends current biosolids land application law by establishing standard complaint and investigation procedures, including the maintenance of a searchable electronic database of complaints bytheVirginiaDepartmentofHealth(VDH).Thebillrequiresnutrientmanagementplans(NMPs) preparedbypersonscertifiedbytheVirginiaDepartmentofConservationandRecreation(DCR)for alllandapplicationsites, regardless of the frequency of application. Under current VDH regulations, only sites where biosolids are applied more than once every 3 years are required to prepare NMPspriortopermitissuance. The billals or equires DCRa pprovalofallNMPsforsiteswherebiosolids are land applied more than once very 3 years at a gronomic rates. The bill allows VDH to incorporateintothepermitreasonablesite -specificspecialconditionstoprotecttheenvironmentorthehealth, safetyandwelfareofpersonsresidinginthevicinityoftheproposedapplicationsite. VDHmustalso includeinitsnoticeofspecialconditionssuchsite -specificconditionsrecommended by the locality. The permitapplicant will have at least 14 days to res pondtotheproposedconditionsandany objections shall be heard by the State Health Commissioner. The bill requires permit holders to provideVDHwithevidenceoffinancialresponsibility,tobeestablishedbyregulation,whichshallbe availabletopay claimsforcleanupcosts, personalinjury and property damage. The bill creates aland applicationcertificationprogramtobeestablishedby VDH pursuant to which all future land applicationsites must have a certified land applicator on location at all timesduringtheapplication process. The bill grants localities that have adopted a biosolid stesting and monitoring or dinance the authoritytoordertheabatementoflandapplicationactivityforviolationsofrelevantlawsand regulations. Finally, the ebillrequests that VDH review certain reports of the National Research Councilandthe United States Environmental Protection Agency, reportits finding stothe Virginia BoardofHealthbyJune30,2004,andifrequestedbytheBoard,initiaterulemaking proceedingsby September1,2004.

- 7. Budgetamendmentnecessary: No.
- **8. Fiscalimplications:** Sewagesludgeislandappliedtoapproximately40,000acresannuallyin Virginia. Theaddedrequirement of nutrientmanagementplans (NMPs) to be developed by certified nutrientmanagement planners for all sewages ludge applications it es will result in an estimated

additional300to450nutrientmanagementplansperyear. Theplansareanticipated to be develo ped byemployeesofthesewagesludgelandapplicationcontractorsthatwillneedtobetrainedand certifiedthroughtheDepartmentofConservationandRecreation's nutrientmanagement certification program. Aspartof the certification program, the depa rtmenthasauditproceduresaddressedin regulation4VAC5 -15-10et.seq.wherebyseveralofthenutrientmanagementplansdevelopedby eachcertifiedindividualmaybeauditedannuallytodeterminecompliancewithrequirements for NMPsin4VAC5 -15-10e t.seq.Thebillalsowillincreaselocalgovernmentauthoritytooverseethe landapplicationprocessandcollectsamplesofsewagesludgedeliveredtoreceivingsitesfor subsequentlaboratoryanalysisfornutrients, heavymetals, and pathogens. This c hangeisexpectedto resultinadditionalinquiriestoDCRbylocalitiesfornutrientmanagementplanauditsevenabovethe levelofroutineauditsthatDCRwouldbeperforming.

Asindicated, DCR anticipates an increased workload resulting from enactmen toftheproposed changesinthebill.Untilthechangesarefullyimplemented,DCRisunabletoaccuratelypredict whetheradditionalpersonnelandfiscalresourceswillberequiredandisnotidentifyingfiscalimpacts atthistime.

DCR will continue towork to identify where additional personnel and fiscal resources may be required once the billisenacted. The Board of Health is considering the enactment for each permit as authorizedinSection32.1 -164.5oftheCodeofVirginia,tocovertheadmin istrationexpensesofthe biosolidsprogramandregulations. If DCR identifies that additional fiscal resources are needed to implementtheprovisionsofthisbill,DCRwillworkwiththeVirginiaDepartmentofHealthto determinewhetheraportionofthe permitfeeswhichmaybecollected, can be transferred to DCR to coveranyincreasedDCRadministrativecosts. Therebyanyincreased fiscal impact we would expect tobebornebyNGFpermitfees.

- 11. Othercomments: The programmatic or non -regulatory provisions of this bill are consistent with the VirginiaDepartmentofHealth'scurrent planninganddirectioninitsBiosolidsprogram. Theprogram isacomponentoftheagency'sOfficeofEnvironmentalHealthServicesandthespecificregulatory provisionsofthebillcanbemetwithoutfiscalimpacttotheagencyaspartofitsongoing environmentalregulationreviewandsupport.
