Othercomments: Inadditiontothechangesincludedintheenrolledlegislation, the Governoralsoincludedamonghisamendmentstothe2002AppropriationActaproposal alteringtheoperatingstructureoftheVirginiaVeteransCareCenter.Thisproposal, reconstitutingtheagencyasanentirelystate -runenterprise,shouldproducesi gnificantlong-termcostavoidancesavingsfortheagency,includingreductionsinthecostofmedical malpractice,workers' compensation,generalliability,performancebond,automobile insurance,andpropertyinsurance.Intotal,thecostavoidancesavi ngsfromthesereductions intheagency'sinsurancepremiumsequalabout\$2.5million(NGF).
