- **8. Fiscalimplications:** According to the Supreme Cour t, in the 2002 calendary earther ewere 1,538,814 traffic convictions with a fee collection rate of 89.37 per cent. Increasing this fee by \$4 would result in additional general fundrevenues of \$5.5 million.

Inaddition, according to the Supreme Court the rewere 788,300 civil cases and 1,359,110 criminal and traffic cases. Therefore, increasing the fee form is demeanors, criminal actions, and traffic infractions by \$1 would result in an additional \$2.1 million in additional general fund revenues.
