5. Summary/Purpose: Senate Bill 1157 allows income-withholding orders generated by the Department of Social Services' Division of Child Support Enforcement to be issued by firstclass mail.

8. Fiscal implications: In FY 2002, 215,126 income-withholding orders were sent via certified mail at a cost of $\$ 2.67$ per order (or $\$ 574,386$ for the year). Based on these figures, the department estimates that approximately 217,000 orders will be mailed annually. If these orders are sent via certified mail at $\$ 2.90$ per order it would cost the department $\$ 629,300$ per year. However, this legislation would allow the department to send the 217,000 orders via first-class mail at $\$ .58$ per order, resulting in an annual savings of $\$ 503,440$. The identified savings would accrue as special fund revenue in the Division of Child Support Enforcement.
