5.	<b>Summary/Purpose:</b> This bill provides that an unrestorab lyin competent defendant charged with capital murder may be ordered to continue to receive treatment and competency evaluations in definitely during his commitment. Currently, such person would have to be released after five years.

8.	<b>Fiscalimplications:</b> The bill does not appear to have any fiscal impact on the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services (DMHMRSAS). It is too early to determine the number of personst hat would be affected by this bill. Currently, it applies to five individuals in the system and means that in stead of a length of stay from 2 to 5 years, the length of stay could be renewable on an indeterminate basis by the courts if continued ho spitalization is deemed medically appropriate. In addition, individuals would be transferred from a civil unit to a forensic unit, resulting in higher treatment costs. However, current operating be dlimits for both civil and forensic units are sufficient to hand let he individuals covered by this bill. One negative impact is that since length of stay would increase, the turn over in beds will be less, and length of time on waiting list for individuals needing services could increase.
