4. Title Commercial driver's licenses; hazardous materials endorsement.

5. Summary/Purpose:

Commercial driver's licenses; hazardous materials endorsement. Meets the requirements of the U.S.A. Patriot Act of 2001 which, in part, prohibits issuance by states of commercial driver's licenses with hazardous materials endorsements unless the U.S. Secretary of Transportation certifies that the applicant poses no security risk.

8. Fiscal implications:

Since the U.S. Department of Transportation has not yet promulgated rules and regulations for the implementation of the Patriot Act, this legislation is of an enabling nature. Once these regulations have been promulgated, the specific fiscal impact can then be determined. For example, the regulations may require the Virginia State Police to collect fingerprints from applicants seeking a hazmat endorsement.
