If the \$100 fee is added it should generate approximately \$2.8 millioneach year assuming that all convicted persons actually pay the fee. Given the difficulty incollecting the fees, it is difficult to estimate the exact amount of revenues that will be collected. Assuming a 90 percent collection rate would equal approximately \$2.5 million in annual revenues.
