If the \$100 is added it should generate approximately \$2.8 millioneachyear assuming that all convicted persons actually pay the fee. It is not certain though how many individuals are subject to breath or bloods amples. Given this and the difficulty incollecting all fees, it is difficult to estimate the exact amount of revenues that will be collected. However, assuming that 20 percent of the convictions would not be subject to breath or blood samples and that 10 percent of the fees would remain uncollected, this legislation would provide approximately \$2.0 million in annual revenues.
