**4. Title** Public-Private Education Facilities and Infrastructure Act of 2002.

**5. Summary/Purpose:** This bill clarifies that a responsible public entity may reject any unsolicited proposal and that, if a proposal is rejected, any fees related to the proposal must be returned to the private entity. In addition, the bill requires a responsible public entity to advertise a private entity's request for approval of a qualifying project in the Virginia Business Opportunities publication and, in the case of a state agency, to also post a notice on the Commonwealth's electronic procurement website. The bill also (i) provides for a responsible public entity to post and publish a private entity's request for approval of a qualifying project for a period of time appropriate to encourage competition, and (ii) clarifies that a qualifying project must consist of a specific project and may not include multi-year arrangements related to unspecified projects.
