	This bill would extend to July 1, 2008, the sunset dates for certain medical related (§ 58.1-609.7) retail sales and use tax exemptions for various nonprofit organizations. The exemptions are scheduled to expire July 1, 2003.

8.	Fiscal implications:		
	The value of extending the exemptions extended by this bill is estimated to be \$62.1 million (state: \$48.0 million; local: \$14.1 million) in FY 2004 and \$69.7 million (state: \$53.9 million; local: \$15.8 million) in FY 2005. This bill would not necessitate a budget amendment as the official budget estimates assume the extension of all these expiring exemptions. The administrative costs associated with this bill would be minimal.

This bill would extend to July 1, 2008, the sunset dates for 29 retail sales and use tax exemptions in the medical related group. The exemptions are scheduled to expire July 1, 2003.

The sunset dates in this bill are consistent with the schedule for reviewing sales tax exemptions established under Code of Virginia § 30-19.05.

SB 742 -1-01/14/03 This bill is identical to House Bill 1754.

House Bill 1755 and Senate Bill 743 would extend to July 1,2007, the sunset dates for 31 retail sales and use tax exemptions in the educational group.

House Bill 1537 would extend to July 1, 2008, the sunset date for the retail sales and use tax exemption for nonprofit tissue banks. The provisions of House Bill 1537 are included in Senate Bill 742 and House Bill 1754.
