4. Title Definitionofhospitals;certainfacilitiestoberegulatedashospita ls

5. Summary/Purpose:

ThislegislationamendsSection32.1 -123ofthe *CodeofVirginia* toincludeinthedefinition of outpatients urgical hospitals, any clinic or facility that performs 25 or more abortions annually. The billstipulates that such facilities wou ldbesubject to all the statelicensing requirements of Article 1 (Hospital and Nursing Home Licens ure and Inspections), Chapter 5 (Regulations of Medical Care Facilities and Services), of Title 32.1, Health, for outpatient surgical hospitals. The clinic s/facilities that are impacted by the bill for licensing are considered physician of fices. Physicians are currently subject to licensing and oversight by the Board of Medicine, Department of Health Professions (DHP). As an outpatient surgical hospital, a nabortion clinic/facility would also have to submit an application for a Certificate of Public Need (COPN).

8. Fiscalimplications:

This fiscal impacts tatement is based on the current estimate of 14 abortion clinic sinthest ate that would meet the bill'scriteria of performing 25 or more abortions annually. If enacted,

furtherresearchwouldbenecessarytoconfirmwhetherotherclinics/facilitiesmeetthe criteria.

Onceclassified as an outpatient surgical hospi tal, a biennial inspection of each clinic would be required in accordance with the statelic ensure program. A typical licensure inspection takes the equivalent of one week's time of one Medical Facilities Inspector. For the 14 abortion clinics, the annua lwork load for on site inspections, complaint visits, and other associated staff time including preand postins pection preparation is estimated to be the equivalent of 25 weeks' time for one Medical Facilities Inspector at annual cost of \$34,250.

The exis tinglicensing fee for outpatient hospitals is \$75 peryear, which will generate \$1,050 in annual revenue from the 14 abortion clinics.

ThisbillwouldalsorequireabortionclinicstoobtainaCertificateofPublicNeed(COPN). TheaverageCOPNapplica tionfeeforanoutpatientsurgicalhospitalis\$20,000.Ifallofthe existing14clinicssubmittedCOPNapplicationsinFY2004,thetotalrevenuewouldamount to\$280,000.TheVirginiaDepartmentofHealthwouldincursomeadditionalcosts associatedw iththereviewandprocessingofthose14COPNapplicationsbutwouldnot requireadditionalclassifiedstaff.BasedontheBudgetBill(andthe2002Appropriation Act),anyexcessCOPNrevenuesbeyondtheagency'sCOPNexpensesarepaidtotheHealth SystemsAgencies.

Revision:

Currently,Sec.32.1 -27,CodeofVirginia,providesthatanyviolationofaprovisionofTitle 32.1ora regulationof theBoardofHealth shallbeaClass1misdemeanor. Theproposed legislationwouldprovideforadditionalrequ irementsandrestrictionsinTitle32.1. Asa result,itcouldresultinadditionalpersonsconvictedofaClass1misdemeanorandsentenced tojailterms.

AnyoneconvictedofaClass1 misdemeanorissubjecttoasentenceofupto12months in jail.T hereisnotenoughinformationavailabletoreliablyestimatehowmanyadditional inmatesinjailcouldresultfromthisproposal.Anyincreaseinjailpopulationwillincrease coststothestate.TheCommonwealthpaysthelocalities\$8.00adayforeach misdemeanant orotherwiselocalresponsibleprisonerheldinajail.Italsofundsmostofthejails'operating costs, e.g. correctionalofficers.Thestate'sshareofthesecostsonaperprisoner, perday basisvariesfromlocalitytolocality.Howeve r, accordingtotheCompensationBoard, the estimatedtotalstatesupportforlocaljailsaveraged\$31.86perinmate, perdayinFY2001.
