4. Title Admittance, parking and use at Department -owned facilities; penalty

5. Summary/Purpose: The bill allows the Board of Game and Inland Fisheries to establish admittance, parking, or other use fees at Department -owned facilities. Any daily fee shall not exceed three dollars and any annual fee shall not exceed the cost of an annual state resident hunting or fishing license. However, no fee shall apply to (i) any person holding a valid hunting, trapping, or fishing permit, or a current certificate of boat registration, (ii) persons 16 years of age or younger, or (iii) the use of department -owned boat ramps. Anyone violating this section may be assessed a civil penalty of \$50 by the Department, to be paid into the Game Protection Fund.

7. Budget amendment necessary: No.

8. Fiscal implications: The bill would have a minor administrative impact on the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries. The agency would have to develop a mechanism to provide for the collection and enforcement of the fees. Also, any fee revenue or civil penalties collected would generate additional revenue for the agency. However, the type of fee, places it would be collected and the amount of any fee has not yet been determined and thus the agency cannot estimate the fiscal impact at this time. The court system may be impacted if any civil penalties assessed by the agency were challenged in a court of law.

9. Specific agency or political subdivisions affected: Department of Game and Inland Fisheries and courts.
