Summary/Purpose: The bill would expand coverage under the Line of Duty Acttoin clude any employee of the Department of Emergency Management and any employee of any county, city, or town performing emergency management or emergency services duties. Currently only Department of Emergency Management hazardous materials of ficers are covered under the Line of Duty Act.	
6.	Fiscalimpact: DPBcannotestimatethepotentialfiscalimpactassociatedwiththisbill. The LineofDutyActprovidesforpaymentstobeneficiariesofcertaindeceasedpublicsafety officers. If theofficer's death occurred while in the line of duty, the beneficiary is entitled to receive \$75,000. If the officer's death arose out of and in the course of his employment or was within five years from his date of retirement, the beneficiary is entitled to receive \$25,000. Also, under the Act certain disable dpublics afe tyofficers, their spouses and dependents, and beneficiaries of certain deceased publics afety officers are entitled to receive continued health in surance coverage fully paid for by the Commonwealth. DPBcannot estimate the number of individuals who would potentially be impacted by this bill. While the bill would cover an additional 79 full - time Department of Emergency Management employees, it also would cover an undetermined number of wage employees, including adjunct personnel and reservists. In additi on, the number of local government employees who would be covered under this bill would depend largely on the number and magnitude of any events requiring the performance of emergency management or emergency services duties, which are not defined in the bill.
