Theseprovisionsarerequired pursuant to Section 501 of the federal Gramm -Leach-Bliley Act Financial Services Modernization Act (GLBA). According to this provision, each state insurance department is required to establish appropriate standards to ensure the security and confidentiality of customer records and information; to protect against any anticipated threats or hazards to the security or integrity of such records; and to protect agai nst unauthorized access to such records which could result in substantial harm or inconveniencetoanycustomer.

Interested parties had expressed concerns with subsections C through F of proposed §38.2-613.2. The Bureau of Insurance agreed to ask Senator Wampler to consider an amendment in the nature of a substitute to Senate Bill 878 that would remove subsections C through F of proposed §38.2 -613.2 to address industry concerns. The Bureau further agreed to issue an administrative letter after the enactm ent of this legislation asguidance to the industry inimplementing information security programs.
