5.	Summary/Purpose: This bill grantsplan -approving authorities the opt ion towaive the certificate of competence requirement for land -disturbing activity for agreement sin lieu of a plan. Currently, all plan -approving authorities must require that the name of an individual, who holds a certificate of competence and who will be incharge of and responsible for carrying out the land -disturbing activity, be provided for botherosion and sediment control plans and agreement sin lieu of aplan. An agreement in lieu of aplanisa contract between the plan -approving authority and the landowner used for ensuring proper implementation of conservation measures during construction of a single -family residence.  The bill also provides that if a violation occurs, the person responsible for carrying out the agreement in lieu of a plans hall correct the violation and provide the name of an individual holding a certificate of competency. Failure to provide such name would be a violation.
