

## 1 VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY — CHAPTER

2 *An Act to amend and reenact § 22.1-207.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to family life education.*

5 **Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:**6 **1. That § 22.1-207.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:**

7 § 22.1-207.1. Family life education.

8 The Board of Education shall develop by December 1, 1987, standards of learning and curriculum  
9 guidelines for a comprehensive, sequential family life education curriculum in grades K through 12.  
10 Such curriculum guidelines shall include instruction as appropriate for the age of the student in family  
11 living and community relationships, abstinence education, the value of postponing sexual activity, the  
12 benefits of adoption as a positive choice in the event of an unwanted pregnancy, human sexuality,  
13 human reproduction, *steps to take to avoid sexual assault, and the availability of counseling and legal*  
14 *resources, and, in the event of such sexual assault, the importance of immediate medical attention and*  
15 *advice, as well as the requirements of the law* and the etiology, prevention and effects of sexually  
16 transmitted diseases.

17 All such instruction shall be designed to promote parental involvement, foster positive self concepts  
18 and provide mechanisms for coping with peer pressure and the stresses of modern living according to  
19 the students' developmental stages and abilities. The Board shall also establish requirements for  
20 appropriate training for teachers of family life education, which shall include training in instructional  
21 elements to support the various curriculum components.

22 By December 1, 1987, the Board of Education shall provide the House Committee on Appropriations  
23 and the Senate Committee on Finance an analysis of the state and local fiscal impact of implementing a  
24 mandatory statewide family life education program and a recommended apportionment of state and local  
25 funding for such programs if not otherwise determined by law.

26 For the purposes of this section, "abstinence education" means an educational or motivational  
27 component which has as its exclusive purpose teaching the social, psychological, and health gains to be  
28 realized by teenagers' abstaining from sexual activity before marriage.
