That § 22.1-98 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 11 12 § 22.1-98. Reduction of state aid when length of school term below 180 days or 990 hours. 13 If the length of the term of any school in a school division is less than 180 teaching days or 990 14 hours in any school year, the amount paid by the Commonwealth from the Basic School Aid Fund shall, 15 except as hereinafter provided or as otherwise provided by law, be reduced in the same proportion as the length of the term has been reduced from 180 teaching days or 990 hours. The Board of Education 16 may authorize, in regulations promulgated pursuant to the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et 17 seq.), any school in a school division which is operated on a year-round basis on a 45/15-day schedule 18 and which is unable to meet the 180-day or 990-hour requirement because severe weather conditions, 19 20 and other emergency situations presenting a threat to the health or safety of the students, including, but not limited to, energy shortages or power failures have required the closing of such school to make up 21 22 the teaching days lost by making up the number of instructional hours equivalent to such teaching days 23 without a proportionate reduction in the amount paid by the Commonwealth from the Basic School Aid 24 Fund. 25 The Superintendent of Public Instruction, with the approval of the Board of Education, shall 26 authorize such reduction as may be necessary in the length of the term for any school or school division 27 without a proportionate reduction in the amount paid by the Commonwealth from the Basic School Aid 28 Fund when severe weather conditions, and other emergency situations presenting a threat to the health or 29 safety of the students, including, but not limited to, energy shortages or power failures have required, as 30 determined in accordance with regulations of the Board of Education, the closing of such school or the 31 schools in such school division for no more than ten days in any school year if at least five teaching days shall be made up. In any case in which severe weather conditions, and other emergency situations 32 33 presenting a threat to the health or safety of the students, including, but not limited to, energy shortages 34 or power failures have required the closing of such school or the schools in the school division for more 35 than ten days, but less than fifteen days, five days plus each day in excess of ten days up to fifteen days 36 shall be made up. In any case in which severe weather conditions, and other emergency situations 37 presenting a threat to the health or safety of the students, including, but not limited to, energy shortages

because of authorization by the Superintendent of Public Instruction of any reduction in the length of the 42 term of any school or school division.

43 The foregoing provisions of this section notwithstanding, the Board of Education may waive the 44 requirement that school divisions provide additional teaching days to compensate for school closings resulting from a declared state of emergency. If the Board grants such a waiver, there shall be no 45 proportionate reduction in the amount paid by the Commonwealth from the Basic School Aid Fund. 46 47 However, the local appropriations for educational purposes necessary to fund 180 teaching days shall not be proportionally reduced by any local governing body due any reduction in the length of the term 48 49 of any school or school division permitted by such waiver.

necessary to fund 180 teaching days shall not be proportionally reduced by any local governing body

50 If the professional personnel of any such school division actually render service for less than the 51 contracted period for such school year and if their compensation is reduced because of insufficient funds 52 or other reason, the proportionate amount paid by the Commonwealth for the personnel component of 53 the Basic School Aid Fund for such school year shall be reduced pro rata. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the school board of any school division in which the length of term for 54 55 any school or for the school division is reduced as provided in this section may pay its professional personnel such salary as they would have received if the term had not been so reduced. The Board of 56 57 Education shall approve for each school division the closing date for the school year beyond which days 58 would not be required to be made up.

- With the exception of the Basic School Aid Fund as provided for above, the Commonwealth may not distribute funds to a locality for costs not incurred when the school term is reduced below 180 days or 59
