That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 11 of Title 54.1 an article 10 numbered 4, consisting of sections numbered 54.1-1140 through 54.1-1143, as follows: 11 12 Article 4. 13 Certification of Elevator Mechanics. 14 § 54.1-1140. Definitions. 15 As used in this article, unless the context requires a different meaning: "Elevator mechanic" means an individual who is certified by the Board in accordance with this 16 17 article who is engaged in erecting, constructing, installing, altering, servicing, repairing, testing or maintaining elevators, escalators, dumbwaiters, or related conveyances in accordance with the 18 Uniform Statewide Building Code. However, a person not certified as an elevator mechanic may 19 20 perform maintenance that is not related to the operating integrity of an elevator, escalator, [21 dumbwaiter] or related conveyance, as provided in the regulations of the Board. 22 § 54.1-1141. Requirements for certification. A. Effective July 1, 2005, no individual shall present himself as a certified elevator mechanic as 23 24 defined in § 54.1-1140 unless he has been certified under the provisions of this article. Individuals certified as elevator mechanics shall not be required to hold any other professional or occupational 25 26 license or certification; however, nothing in this subsection shall prohibit an individual from holding 27 more than one professional or occupational license or certification. 28 B. Any individual desiring to be certified as an elevator mechanic shall file a written application on 29 a form prescribed by the Board. The application shall be accompanied by a fee set by the Board 30 pursuant to § 54.1-201. The application shall contain, at a minimum, the applicant's name, place of 31 employment, business address, and information on the knowledge, skills, abilities and education or 32 training of the applicant. 33 § 54.1-1142. Issuance of certification. 34 A. The Board shall issue a certificate to practice as an elevator mechanic in the Commonwealth to 35 any applicant who has submitted satisfactory evidence that he has successfully: 1. Completed the educational requirements as required by the Board, which shall at a minimum 36 37 include such requirements as the Board determines will establish minimum competency on the part of 38 the applicant; 39 2. Completed the experience requirements as required by the Board, which shall at a minimum 40 consist of at least three years in the elevator industry; and 41 3. Passed an examination offered or approved by the Board. 42 B. The Board may issue a certificate to practice as a certified elevator mechanic to any applicant who has a certification from an association approved by the Board that is equal to or exceeds the 43 44 requirements established by the Board for all applicants. C. Any individual who applies for certification as an elevator mechanic between July 1, 2004, and 45 July 1, 2005, shall be deemed to have fulfilled the examination requirement if he is able to demonstrate 46 47 that he has at least five years experience as an elevator mechanic. **48** § 54.1-1143. Continuing education. 49 A. The Board shall establish in the regulations requirements for continuing education as a prerequisite to renewal of any certificate issued under this article. The Board shall require evidence of 50 51 knowledge of the Uniform Statewide Building Code changes as a prerequisite to renewal of any certificate issued under this article. In addition, the Board may require continuing education for any 52 53 individual who is found to be in violation of law or regulations governing the practice of an elevator 54 mechanic certified under this article. 55 B. An elevator mechanic, as a condition of recertification and as part of the recertification application, shall certify to the Board that he has completed at least eight hours of continuing 56 education, approved by the Board, in the specialty of elevator/escalator contracting. The Board may 57 establish such requirements for approval of training instructors, the criteria for the continuing education 58

and such other regulations to ensure the protection of the public interest. Such criteria shall include

approval of curriculum sponsored by national or state professional elevator industry associations
approved by the Board.
