4	A BILL to amend and reenact § 46.2-750 of the Code of Virginia, relating to registration of motor
5	vehicles owned by regional jail authorities.

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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 46.2-750 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 46.2-750. Vehicles of Commonwealth, its political subdivisions, and regional jail authorities.
13	A. Motor vehicles, trailers, and semitrailers owned by the Commonwealth and, political subdivisions
14	thereof of the Commonwealth, and regional jail authorities created pursuant to Article 3.1 (§ 53.1-95.2
15	et seq.) of Chapter 3 of Title 53.1 and used solely for governmental purposes shall be registered and
16	shall display license plates as provided in this section. The fee for such license plates shall be equal to
17	the cost incurred by the Department in the purchase or manufacture of such license plates. The fees
18	received by the Commissioner under this section shall be paid into the state treasury and shall be set
19	aside as a special fund to be used to meet the expenses of the Department of Motor Vehicles.
20	License plates issued for vehicles owned by the Commonwealth, except plates issued to be used (i)
21	on vehicles devoted solely to police work, (ii) by the Virginia Economic Development Partnership to the
22	extent approved by the Governor, or (iii) by the Governor and the Attorney General, shall have
23	conspicuously and legibly inscribed, stamped, or printed thereon words stating that the vehicle is for
24	official state use only. The Commissioner shall reserve a unique series of numbers for use on such
25	license plates and shall provide for a design and combination of colors which distinguish such license
26 27	plates from those issued for vehicles owned by the political subdivisions of the Commonwealth.
27 28	License plates issued for vehicles owned by political subdivisions of the Commonwealth and regional jail authorities, except such plates issued to be used (i) on vehicles used by any local or
29 29	regional economic development authority, agency, instrumentality, or organization, upon the request of
30	the chief administrative officer of the affected locality (or, in the case of regional organizations, the
31	chief administrative officer of any of the affected localities) or (ii) on vehicles devoted solely to police
32	work, shall have conspicuously and legibly inscribed, stamped, or printed thereon words stating that the
33	vehicle is for official local government use only. The Commissioner shall reserve a unique series of
34	numbers for use on such license plates and shall provide for a design and combination of colors which
35	distinguish such license plates from those issued for vehicles owned by the Commonwealth.
36	License plates issued for vehicles owned by the Commonwealth and the political subdivisions thereof
37	which have inscribed, stamped, or printed thereon the words "Public Use" may be used only on the
38	vehicle for which they were issued prior to January 1, 1990, but in no case shall such license plates be
39	used for any vehicle after December 31, 1992.
40	No other license plates shall be used on vehicles for which official use plates have been issued,
41	except for vehicles used solely for police work and as provided in subsection B of this section.
42	B. In addition to any other license plate authorized by this section, the Commissioner may issue
43	permanent or temporary license plates for use on vehicles owned by the Commonwealth or any of its
44 45	departments, institutions, boards, or agencies and used for security or transportation purposes in
+5 46	conjunction with conferences, meetings, or other events involving the Governor or members of the
+0 47	General Assembly. No state agency shall use government funds to cover the costs of any license plates issued under this subsection. The design of these license plates shall be at the discretion of the
4 8	Commissioner. These license plates shall be issued under the following conditions:
49	1. For each set of permanent license plates issued, the Commissioner shall charge a fee of \$100. The
50	Commissioner shall limit the validity of any set of license plates issued under this subdivision to no
51	more than thirty30 consecutive days. The Commissioner's written authorization for use of any set of
52	license plates issued under this subdivision shall be kept in the vehicle on which the license plates are
53	displayed until expiration of the authorization.
54	2. The Commissioner shall limit the validity of each set of temporary license plates to no more than
55	fourteen14 consecutive days. For each set of temporary license plates, the Commissioner shall charge a

56 fee of twenty-five dollars\$25 for the first set and two dollars\$2 for each additional set. The
57 Commissioner's written authorization for use of any set of license plates issued under this subdivision
58 shall be kept in the vehicle on which the license plates are displayed until expiration of the

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
