9	WHEREAS, an estimated 750,000 Virginians live in poverty, with insufficient resources to ensure a
10	decent standard of living; and
11	WHEREAS, 25 percent of Virginia's families live in low-income and poor-income situations; and
12 13	WHEREAS, these statistics represent 452,477 children; and
13	WHEREAS, everyday the problems of feeding, housing, and general self-care are faced by these
14 15	families; and
15	WHEREAS, food stamps provide aid, but not necessarily adequate aid; and
16	WHEREAS, the expense and lack of availability of nutritious food leads to unhealthy diets, obesity,
17	and shortened attention spans of children in these low-income families; and
18	WHEREAS, Virginia legislators must make difficult decisions that directly affect the lives of these
19	families; and
20	WHEREAS, an opportunity for Virginia's legislators to experience first-hand the plight of the
21	Commonwealth's low-income families may result in a deeper understanding of their plight; and
22	WHEREAS, Virginia legislators who volunteer will be given the opportunity to budget their food
23	purchases in a manner similar to the Commonwealth's low-income families; and
24	WHEREAS, legislators who volunteer will receive an information packet describing the program and
25	would be restricted to using the same amount of money that is allotted in food stamps to a single
26	individual and would be bound to use that amount under the same restrictions that apply to families that
27	use food stamps; and WHEPEAS, the understam two much groups would be timed to estimate with Would Food Day
28	WHEREAS, the voluntary two-week program would be timed to coincide with World Food Day,
29 30	October 16, 2004, a program sponsored by the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization; now, therefore be it
