5	Higher Education for Virginia to develop a template for a statewide articulation agreement. Report.

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10	WHEREAS, the Advisory Council on Career and Technical Education is established in Chapter 30
11	(§ 30-198 et seq.) of Title 30 and among its charges is to facilitate coordination of public school career
12	and technical services, workforce training programs, and efforts among agencies and institutions of the
13	Commonwealth; and
14	WHEREAS, in this regard, the Advisory Council has received much information from the
15	Department of Education, the Community College System, the local school divisions, and the Governor's
16	workforce development initiative; and
17 18	WHEREAS, the Advisory Council has received testimony that the elements and development of
10 19	articulation agreements may be uneven across the Commonwealth's school divisions and between and among the Commonwealth's community colleges and public institutions of higher education; and
20	WHEREAS, articulation agreements can provide a seamless pathway for students to progress from
21	high school to community college to complete industry certifications and obtain state licensures and, for
22	certain students, this seamless pathway will lead to enrollment in four-year institutions of higher
23	education; and
24	WHEREAS, an educated workforce is the Commonwealth's only way to maintain its economic base
25	while improving incentives for business and industry to locate in Virginia; and
26	WHEREAS, the Advisory Council has also been informed that articulation will be receiving
27	substantial attention by the Community College System; and
28	WHEREAS, the Advisory Council believes that articulation agreements can benefit all parties, i.e.,
29 30	students, schools, community colleges, and four-year institutions, by eliminating duplication of course work for students and reducing the time and money required to obtain post-secondary training and
31	education; and
32	WHEREAS, therefore, the Advisory Council believes that all levels of public education should
33	cooperate in the development of a template for a statewide articulation agreement in the Commonwealth
34	in order to facilitate students' movement through a K-16 system that allows smooth transitions between
35	high school, community college, and four-year institutions of higher education; now, therefore, be it
36	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Board of Education, the
37	State Community College Board, and the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia be requested to
38	develop a template for a statewide articulation agreement.
39 40	In developing a template, the Board of Education, the State Community College Board, and the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia shall (i) appoint a taskforce of staffers and stakeholders to
41	identify obstacles and issues that must be considered, including any issues relating to credentialing of
42	teachers and how credits can be transferred from one high school to another, from any high school to
43	any community college, and from any community college to the public four-year institutions of higher
44	education; and (ii) direct the taskforce to develop a template that provides for flexibility for school
45	divisions, community colleges, and four-year institutions of higher education taking into account the
46	various curricula that are offered in the many schools, colleges, and universities and the local economic
47	and other conditions.
48 49	The Board of Education, the State Community College Board, and the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia shall ensure that the template includes (a) some standardization of credit transfers
49 50	Education for Virginia shall ensure that the template includes (a) some standardization of credit transfers from high school to community colleges across the Commonwealth and from community colleges to
50 51	public and private four-year institutions of higher education across the Commonwealth; (b) provides
52	options for the various corners of the Commonwealth that are tailored to match the capabilities of the
53	educational agencies in local areas while offering opportunities for improvement in cooperation and
54	collaboration between and among the various levels of education; and (c) a list of programs and courses
55	that are articulated from one level to another, the identity of the educational agencies that are articulated
56	for each program or course, the tuition charges for the various classes at the different levels, information
57	on limitations on enrollment in the various programs or classes, and the effect, if any, on tuition charges
58	of articulation agreements in the community colleges and four-year institutions of higher education.

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59 Technical assistance shall be provided to the Board of Education, State Community College Board, 60 and the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia by the local directors of career and technical 61 education in the public schools, the division superintendents, the presidents of the community colleges, 62 and the presidents of the four-year institutions of higher education. All agencies of the Commonwealth 63 shall provide assistance to the Board of Education, State Community College Board, and the State 64 Council of Higher Education for Virginia for this study, upon request. Input may also be received from Virginia's private institutions of higher education, upon request. 65

The Board of Education, State Community College Board, and the State Council of Higher Education 66 for Virginia shall complete their meetings on this matter and shall report on the statewide articulation 67 agreement template to the Advisory Council on Career and Technical Education by November 30, 2004. 68

The Board of Education, State Community College Board, and the State Council of Higher Education 69 for Virginia shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report of its findings and recommendations (for publication as a document). The executive summary and report 70

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shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for 72 the processing of legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of the 2005 Regular 73

Session of the General Assembly and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website. 74
