10	WHEREAS, payment for prescription drugs is the fastest growing segment of health care
11	expenditures both at the national level and here in the Commonwealth; and
12	WHEREAS, an estimated one million to two million Americans buy prescription drugs from
13 14	Canadian businesses, where they are up to 50 percent cheaper because of price controls; and
14	WHEREAS, the Commonwealth spent a total of \$105.1 million on pharmacy costs for insured state employees in Fiscal Year 2003, which was a 13 percent overall increase from Fiscal Year 2002; and
16	WHERAS, Illinois, Michigan, Iowa and Minnesota recently announced that they are exploring the
17	option of purchasing prescription drugs from Canada for insured state workers because rising drug costs
18	are forcing them to cut other services; and
19	WHEREAS, effective pharmaceuticals improve the quality of life for the Commonwealth's elderly
20	citizens and help contain the health care costs associated with aging; and
21	WHEREAS, Wisconsin recently announced that it is exploring with Canadian officials innovative
22	ways to increase access to lower-priced Canadian prescription drugs for Wisconsin's elderly citizens on
23	fixed incomes, while assuring the highest level of safety; now, therefore, be it
24	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Congress of the United
25	States be urged to remove current restrictions on the purchasing of prescription drugs from Canada; and,
26 27	be it RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates transmit copies of this resolution
