WHEREAS, the federal mission of the Virginia National Guard is to provide trained and equipped 6 7 units to augment the active Army and Air Force during times of war, national emergency, or 8 Presidential selected reserve call-up; and

WHEREAS, in addition, the Virginia National Guard provides units to assist civil authorities in 9 10 protecting life and property and preserving peace, order, and public safety during periods of natural or 11 man-made disaster; and

WHEREAS, since September 11, 2001, the Virginia National Guard, consisting of the 7,500 soldiers 12 of the Virginia Army National Guard and the 1,200 airmen of the Virginia Air National Guard, has 13 14 played an increasingly vital role in protecting the nation and pursuing the war on terror; and

15 WHEREAS, units of the Virginia National Guard have deployed in support of operations devoted to 16 homeland defense (Operation Noble Eagle), the war on terror outside of the United States (Operation Enduring Freedom), and coalition operations in Iraq (Operation Iraqi Freedom); and 17

18 WHEREAS, as part of Operation Enduring Freedom, members of the Virginia National Guard served 19 in Afghanistan and Kuwait; and

20 WHEREAS, several Virginia National Guard units deployed to Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi 21 Freedom; and

22 WHEREAS, as a vital part of the nation's homeland defense, many units of the Virginia Army 23 National Guard and the Virginia Air National Guard were called to active duty and stationed across the 24 country; and

25 WHEREAS, the soldiers and airmen of the Virginia National Guard provided valuable service to the 26 Commonwealth, assisting in flood recovery operations in May 2002, helping local officials in the Valley 27 cope with severe winter weather in February 2003, and, most recently, providing support in recovery 28 operations following Hurricane Isabel in September 2003; and

29 WHEREAS, at the height of the Hurricane Isabel recovery operations, more than 1,100 soldiers and airmen of the Virginia National Guard worked to clear roads, distribute badly needed ice and water, 30 assess damage, and provide security and traffic control assistance; and 31

WHEREAS, the men and women of the Virginia National Guard, whether working to make America 32 33 safer at home, fighting the global war on terror, or helping Virginians recover from natural disasters, serve their nation and their Commonwealth with great courage, dedication, and devotion to duty; and 34

35 WHEREAS, more than 1,400 men and women of the Virginia National Guard presently are deployed away from their homes and families, many in areas with great personal risks and many at great personal 36 37 and financial sacrifice; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby 38 commend the soldiers and airmen of the Virginia National Guard; and, be it 39

40 RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution 41 for presentation to Major General Claude A. Williams, Adjutant General of the Virginia National Guard, as an expression of the admiration and gratitude of the General Assembly and the people of Virginia. 42
