## **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 348**

3 On the death of George Mason Green, Jr.

5 WHEREAS, George Mason Green, Jr., of McLean, who represented Arlington in the House of
7 Delegates for two terms, died on January 4, 2004; and

8 WHEREAS, a native of Washington, D.C., Mason Green was a direct descendant of founding father 9 George Mason of Gunston Hall; and

- WHEREAS, a lifelong resident of Northern Virginia, Mason Green was educated in the Arlington
   County public schools, Episcopal High School, and the University of South Carolina; and
- 12 WHEREAS, a principal in three successful Northern Virginia firms, Mason Green began his political 13 career as chairman of the Virginia Young Republicans and was a delegate to the 1968 Republican 14 National Convention: and
- WHEREAS, elected to the House of Delegates in 1969, Mason Green represented the citizens ofArlington from 1970 to 1974; and
- WHEREAS, while a member of the House of Delegates, Mason Green served on the Roads andInternal Navigation, Labor, and Counties, Cities and Towns Committees; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Mason Green was a member of the Children of the American Revolution and the Sons
  20 of Confederate Veterans and was the founder of the Southern Literary Alliance, an organization
  21 dedicated to the history of the South; and
- WHEREAS, Mason Green served the citizens of Arlington with distinction in the House of
   Delegates, and his contributions to Northern Virginia will be long remembered; now, therefore, be it
   RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby
- note with great sadness the loss of a distinguished Virginian, George Mason Green, Jr.; and, be it
   RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution
- for presentation to the family of George Mason Green, Jr., as an expression of the esteem in which hismemory is held by the members of the General Assembly and the citizens of Virginia.
