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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY — CHAPTER

An Act to amend and reenact §§ 15.2-904 and 15.2-905 of the Code of Virginia, relating to inoperable motor vehicles.

6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

7 1. That §§ 15.2-904 and 15.2-905 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows:

§ 15.2-904. Authority to restrict keeping of inoperable motor vehicles, etc., on residential or
 9 commercial property; removal of such vehicles; penalty.

10 A. Any locality may, by ordinance, provide that it shall be unlawful for any person to keep, except within a fully enclosed building or structure or otherwise shielded or screened from view, on any 11 12 property zoned for residential or commercial or agricultural purposes any motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer, as such are defined in § 46.2-100, which is inoperable. Any locality in addition may, by 13 14 ordinance, limit the number of inoperable motor vehicles which any person may keep outside of a fully enclosed building or structure, but which are shielded or screened from view by covers. As used in this 15 section, an " inoperable motor vehicle" means any motor vehicle which is not in operating condition; or 16 which for a period of 60 days or longer has been partially or totally disassembled by the removal of 17 tires and wheels, the engine, or other essential parts required for operation of the vehicle or on which 18 19 there are displayed neither valid license plates nor a valid inspection decal. However, the provisions of 20 this section shall not apply to a licensed business which on June 26, 1970, is regularly engaged in 21 business as an automobile dealer, salvage dealer or scrap processor.

B. Any locality may, by ordinance, further provide that: (i) the owners of property zoned for 22 23 residential, commercial or agricultural purposes shall, at such time or times as the locality prescribes, 24 remove therefrom any such inoperable motor vehicles, trailers or semitrailers that are not kept within a 25 fully enclosed building or structure; (ii) such locality through its own agents or employees may remove 26 any such inoperable motor vehicles, trailers or semitrailers, whenever the owner of the premises, after 27 reasonable notice, has failed to do so; (iii) in the event such locality, through its own agents or employees, removes any such motor vehicles, trailers or semitrailers, after having given such reasonable 28 29 notice, such locality may dispose of such motor vehicles, trailers or semitrailers after giving additional 30 notice to the owner of the vehicle; (iv) the cost of any such removal and disposal shall be chargeable to 31 the owner of the vehicle or premises and may be collected by the locality as taxes are collected; and (v) 32 every cost authorized by this section with which the owner of the premises has been assessed shall 33 constitute a lien against the property from which the vehicle was removed, the lien to continue until 34 actual payment of such costs has been made to the locality. Notwithstanding the other provisions of this 35 subsection, if the owner of such vehicle can demonstrate that he is actively restoring or repairing the 36 vehicle, and if it is shielded or screened from view, the vehicle and one additional inoperative motor 37 vehicle being used for the restoration or repair may remain on the property.

C. The governing body of any locality may by ordinance provide that violations of this section shall be subject to a civil penalty, not to exceed \$50 for the first violation, or violations arising from the same set of operative facts. The civil penalty for subsequent violations not arising from the same set of operative facts within 12 months of the first violation shall not exceed \$200. Each business day during which the same violation is found to have existed shall constitute a separate offense. In no event shall a series of specified violations arising from the same set of operative facts result in civil penalties that exceed a total of \$3,000 in a 12-month period.

D. Except as provided in this subsection, adoption of an ordinance pursuant to subsection C shall be
in lieu of criminal penalties and shall preclude prosecution of such violation as a misdemeanor. The
governing body of any locality may, however, by ordinance provide that such violations shall be a Class
3 misdemeanor in the event three civil penalties have previously been imposed on the same defendant
for the same or similar violation, not arising from the same set of operative facts, within a 24-month
period. Classifying such subsequent violations as criminal offenses shall preclude the imposition of civil
penalties for the same violation.

52 *E.* As used in this section, notwithstanding any other provision of law, general or special, "shielded 53 or screened from view" means not visible by someone standing at ground level from outside of the 54 property on which the subject vehicle is located.

55 § 15.2-905. Authority to restrict keeping of inoperable motor vehicles, etc., on residential or commercial property in certain localities; removal of such vehicles.

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57 A. The governing body of any county having adopted the urban county executive form of 58 government; any county contiguous thereto; the county manager form; any town located, wholly or 59 partly, in such counties; any city contiguous to a county having adopted the urban county executive 60 form of government or surrounded by a county contiguous thereto; any city having a population between 61 35,000 and 40,000, any city having a population between 60,000 and 70,000 and any city having a 62 population between 95,000 and 105,000 may by ordinance prohibit any person from keeping, except within a fully enclosed building or structure or otherwise shielded or screened from view, on any 63 property zoned or used for residential purposes, or on any property zoned for commercial or agricultural 64 purposes, any motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer, as such are defined in § 46.2-100, which is 65 66 inoperable.

67 The locality in addition may by ordinance limit the number of inoperable motor vehicles which any68 person may keep outside of a fully enclosed building or structure.

As used in this section, notwithstanding any other provision of law, general or special, "shielded or screened from view" means hidden from sight by plantings or fences not visible by someone standing at ground level from outside of the property on which the subject vehicle is located.

As used in this section, an "inoperable motor vehicle" means any motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer which is not in operating condition; or does not display valid license plates; or does not display an inspection decal that is valid or does display an inspection decal that has been expired for more than sixty 60 days. The provisions of this section shall not apply to a licensed business which is regularly engaged in business as an automobile dealer, salvage dealer or scrap processor.

77 B. The locality may, by ordinance, further provide that the owners of property zoned or used for 78 residential purposes, or zoned for commercial or agricultural purposes, shall, at such time or times as the 79 governing body may prescribe, remove therefrom any inoperable motor vehicle that is not kept within a 80 fully enclosed building or structure. The locality may remove the inoperable motor vehicle, whenever the owner of the premises, after reasonable notice, has failed to do so. Notwithstanding the other 81 provisions of this subsection, if the owner of such vehicle can demonstrate that he is actively restoring 82 or repairing the vehicle, and if it is shielded or screened from view, the vehicle and one additional 83 84 inoperative motor vehicle being used for the restoration or repair may remain on the property.

In the event the locality removes the inoperable motor vehicle, after having given such reasonable notice, it may dispose of the vehicle after giving additional notice to the owner of the premises. The cost of the removal and disposal may be charged to either the owner of the inoperable vehicle or the owner of the premises and the cost may be collected by the locality as taxes are collected. Every cost authorized by this section with which the owner of the premises has been assessed shall constitute a lien against the property from which the inoperable vehicle was removed, the lien to continue until actual payment of the cost has been made to the locality.
