## **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 120**

Designating the second week in February in 2004, and in each succeeding year, as National Courtesy Week in Virginia.

WHEREAS, National Courtesy Week will be observed nationwide February 9-15, 2004; and

WHEREAS, in Culpeper, where National Courtesy Week has been endorsed by the Mayor of Culpeper and by the School Board, public servants, public agencies, and the students and staff of the Culpeper public schools will observe courtesy throughout the week; and

WHEREAS, on Monday, each participant in National Courtesy Week will encourage polite requests; on Tuesday, lead in showing gratitude; and on Wednesday, give sincere compliments; and

WHEREAS, on Thursday of National Courtesy Week, participants will greet others politely; and on Friday, show thoughtfulness to others; and

WHEREAS, the goals of National Courtesy Week are commendable, and expanding the program statewide could bring more civility, respect, and thoughtfulness to public discourse across the Commonwealth; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly designate the second week in February in 2004, and in each succeeding year, as National Courtesy Week in Virginia; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate transmit a copy of this resolution to Gail L. Turnbull, director of the Culpeper Chapter of the National League of Junior Cotillions and the directors of all other affiliates of the National League of Junior Cotillions located in Virginia and made known to the Clerk of the Senate, so that members of the chapter may be apprised of the sense of the General Assembly of Virginia in this matter; and, be it
