of the University of Virginia Health Services Foundation, as president of the Alumni Board of
Managers, as president of the Miller Center for Studies of the Presidency Foundation, as a leading
proponent of the Charlottesville Free Clinic, and as a member of the Board of Visitors of the University
of Virginia; and

16 WHEREAS, Leigh Middleditch has served on the Board of Governors of the American Bar
17 Association, as president of the Virginia Chamber of Commerce, and as a director of the United States
18 Chamber of Commerce; and

WHEREAS, Leigh Middleditch's most significant and lasting contribution to the Commonwealth is
through his role with the Thomas C. Sorensen Institute for Political Leadership, which he cofounded at
the University of Virginia in 1993; and

WHEREAS, from 1994 to 2002, Leigh Middleditch served as chairman of the board of the Sorensen
 Institute, which is a nonpartisan organization dedicated to improving the quality of governance in
 Virginia through education of political leaders in public policy and ethics; and
