3. Committee Senate: Education and Health

4. Title Family life education.

5. Summary/Purpose: This bill adds the use of emergency contraception in response to sexual assault to those items that the Board of Education is to include in its curriculum guidelines for family life education.

Pursuant to the Standards of Accreditation (8 VAC 20-131-170), local school boards are authorized to implement the Standards of Learning for the Family Life Education program promulgated by the Board of Education or a Family Life Education program consistent with the Board's guidelines, which shall have the goals of "reducing the incidence of pregnancy and sexually-transmitted diseases and substance abuse among teenagers."

6. Minimal Fiscal Impact

7. Budget amendment necessary: No.

8. Fiscal implications: The engrossed bill requires the Board of Education to amend its family life education curriculum guidelines to include instruction related to the use of emergency contraception in response to sexual assault.

Minimal costs would be incurred by the Department of Education related to the revision of the family life education guidelines.

There is no change in fiscal impact from the original bill.
