8. Fiscal implications: According to the Supreme Court there were over 102,000 initial civil case filings in circuit court, and over 945,000 new civil cases filed in district court in calendar year 2002. Assuming the number of filings remains relatively constant, it is estimated that approximately \$1,050,000 in additional funding would be available for the Legal Aid Services Fund.

This legislation contains a clause that requires an appropriation in the appropriation act of general funds for a total of 49 positions for the court system in order for the provisions of this legislation to be enacted. The proposed Senate plan contains funding for these positions.
