5. Summary/Purpose:

HB 1198 would authorize the Board of Health to promulgate requirements and criteria for the development and maintenance of an emergency management plan for each community public water supply for the provision of pure water during any extended power outage.

8. Fiscal implications:

The Virginia Department of Health would incur one-time costs to develop the appropriate regulatory changes for this new water supply emergency planning requirement and to

develop a model emergency plan document and guidance for use by community waterworks in meeting the provisions of this bill.

The regulations would be expected to cost no more than \$11,000, including up to 300 hours in water supply engineer staffing time to provide appropriate technical expertise, as well as the administrative costs of promulgating the regulations. The remaining \$14,660 in one-time costs represents VDH's estimate of 450 hours of water supply engineering staff time to develop the model emergency plan document(s) and technical assistance/guidance.
