4. Title Motor carriers; penalty for violation of International Fuels Tax Agreement.

5. Summary/Purpose:

Establishes the violations and penalties for interstate motor carriers operating in Virginia without proper registration and identification markers as required by the International Fuels Tax Agreement (IFTA). Depending upon the nature of the violation, individuals may be charged with either a Class 3 or Class 4 misdemeanor (a maximum fine of \$500 and \$250 respectively). The bill also authorizes the seizure of vehicles when an interstate motor carrier fails to satisfy a judgment.

8. Fiscal implications: The bill proposes individuals who present false identification when accused of violating rules and regulations established by IFTA will be guilty of a Class 3 misdemeanor (a maximum fine of \$500) and any person operating any motor vehicle with improper registration, identification markers or other identification will be guilty of a Class 4 misdemeanor (a maximum fine of \$250). It is not possible at this time to determine the number of persons who might be convicted under this proposal. However, any revenue garnered from the bill would be deposited into the Literary Fund.
