4. Title Stalking

5. Summary/Purpose:

Under current law, stalking is a Class 1 misdemeanor. A third or subsequent conviction within a five-year period is a Class 6 felony. The proposed legislation would make a second conviction occurring within a two-year period a Class 6 felony.

6. Fiscal Impact: Final. See Item 8.

7. Budget amendment necessary: Yes. New Item 420.10.

8. Fiscal implications:

Pursuant to §30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission estimates a fiscal impact of \$93,045 (the highest annual cost over the next six years). The amount is based on the projection that the legislation will result in four additional inmates being incarcerated in prison.
