4. **Title** Juveniles; disposition for those who are delinquent.

5. **Summary/Purpose:**

Delinquent juveniles; disposition. Requires, for juveniles 11 years of age or older who can be committed to the Department of Juvenile Justice for an offense that would be a Class 1 misdemeanor if committed by an adult, that the juvenile must have previously been adjudicated delinquent of three separate class one misdemeanors if committed by an adult, and each such offense was not part of a common act, transaction or scheme.
