4.	Title	Virginia Birth-Related Neurological Injury Compensation Act		
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- **5. Summary/Purpose:** Increases assessments for the Virginia Birth-Related Neurological Injury Compensation Act for participating physicians and hospitals, and nonparticipating physicians on an incremental basis beginning in 2005, to maximums of \$5,500, \$200,000, and \$300, respectively. The bill also establishes threshold birth weight of 2,000 grams (approximately 4.4 pounds) for qualifying infants, and eliminates the authority to pay attorney's fees to applicants who are not admitted into the Virginia Birth-Related Neurological Injury Compensation Program (Program).
- **6.** Fiscal Impact Estimates are not available to the State Corporation Commission (see Item 8)
- 7. Budget amendment necessary: No
- **8. Fiscal implications:** The Bureau of Insurance assumes that the increase in the assessments received by the Virginia Birth-Related Neurological Injury Compensation Program will have a fiscal impact on the Program, but we have no way of estimating the fiscal impact of this legislation. The administrator of the Program may be able to provide actuarial projections as to the reduction in the Program's deficit as a result of this bill.
- **9. Specific agency or political subdivisions affected:** The State Corporation Commission Bureau of Insurance
- 10. Technical amendment necessary: No
- **11. Other comments:** The engrossed version of House Bill 1407 clarifies that the 2000 gram weight requirement does not apply retroactively.
