4. Title Charitable Gaming; denial of permits
5. Summary/Purpose: Prohibits the Department of Charitable gaming from denying, suspending, or revoking the permit of any organization solely because of its failure to meet the required minimum percentage of its gross receipts required to be used for charitable purposes, as prescribed by regulations, provided that (i) the organization is otherwise in compliance with the laws and regulations governing charitable gaming in the Commonwealth; (ii) there are no pending criminal charges or prior convictions against an officer of the organization or game manager involving a felony related to fraud, theft, or financial crimes, or involving a misdemeanor related to moral turpitude; and (iii) the Department determines that an organization has used sufficient proceeds for the purposes specified in subdivision 1 of Section 18.2-340.33 of the Code of Virginia.
The bill also provides that this "waiver" shall expire on when replacement regulations adopted by the Department of Charitable Gaming, as the successor agency for the Charitable Gaming Commission, become effective.
