5. Summary/Purpose: The bill abolishes the Virginia Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations. The Commission no longer has professional staff or appropriation for operations.

8. Fiscal implications: The bill abolishes an advisory commission, which has no appropriation or any professional staff. Therefore, its abolishment has no fiscal impact.

9. Specific agency or political subdivisions affected: Department of Housing and Community Development.

11. Other comments: This bill incorporates HB 252, introduced by Delegate McQuigg and is identical to SB 10, introduced by Senator Ruff.
