**4. Title** Requirements for firearm sales.

**5. Summary/Purpose:** Provides that for the purpose of firearm purchase, the permanent duty post of a member of the armed services is considered his residence. The bill also removes the requirement that the social security number be provided as identification and allows any type of communication with the State Police to ascertain a prospective purchaser's criminal record, not only a telephone call. The bill removes the requirement that firearm safety information be posted and handed out where firearms are sold.
