4. Title Charter schools.

5. Summary/Purpose: This bill directs local school boards to give priority to those public charter school applications targeting student populations served by schools that have not achieved full accreditation; currently, this priority consideration is limited to schools addressing at-risk students. In addition, individual school accreditation plans may be crafted for these schools. The measure also increases the maximum charter term approval or renewal from three to five years.

6. Fiscal Impact: Minimal

7. Budget amendment necessary: No.

8. Fiscal implications: Administrative costs would be incurred by Board of Education related to guideline development. These costs would be minimal. There is no local impact. The amount of funds deposited into the Charter School Assistance Fund cannot be forecast.
