- 8. Fiscal implications: The State Council of Higher Education for Virginia (SCHEV) currently facilitates the development of articulation agreements. The State Council's strategic plan includes efforts "to [ensure] reduced time to degree through seamless transfer between community colleges and senior institutions." The amount of agency resources that will be devoted to this effort depends on the extent to which SCHEV undertakes various programs and activities to achieve this broad policy goal. The Governor's budget, as introduced, included an additional position for SCHEV that could be used to help address any potential additional workload. However, both the House and Senate eliminated this funding in their respective budgets. In addition, the proposed legislation requires SCHEV to develop estimates of the number of degrees to be awarded by each institution and include those estimates in its reports of enrollment projections.
