4. Title Conservators of the peace; registration.

5. Summary/Purpose:

Conservators of the peace. Provides that all conservator of the peace appointments are void on September 15, 2004, unless the conservator has obtained a valid registration issued by the Department of Criminal Justice Services. In addition, each conservator must provide a temporary registration letter issued by the Department of Criminal Justice Services prior to seeking appointment by the circuit court. A circuit court appointment letter must be filed with the Department of Criminal Justice Services in order to receive a special conservator of the peace photo registration card.

6. No Fiscal Impact (or)

7. Budget amendment necessary: None.

8. Fiscal implications: No negative fiscal impact.

9. Specific agency or political subdivisions affected: Department of Criminal Justice Services' (DCJS) Private Security Section and all jurisdictions with individuals appointed as special conservator of the peace.

10. Technical amendment necessary: None.

11. Other comments: This action is to "clean up" language in the original bill and remove any inference that an old special conservator of the peace appointment is/was a lifetime appointment not subject to DCJS' registration provisions. This change will have a minimal but positive fiscal impact to the Private Security Section. Registrations for the conservator of the peace designation has been set at \$60 however a dollar approximation of the impact of this action can not be determined at this time.
